The Chairperson extended a warm welcome to all the members. After completing the quorum, the agenda items were taken up for discussion.

1. 11.1: Reward and Recognition for brilliant performance by student.

To encourage and applaud students who perform well in extra-curricular activities, IQAC advised Academic office to institute a scholarship/financial award/certificates. This initiative will boost more confidence in students to engage in extra-curricular activities and discover their true potential.

2. 11.2: Summer Internship Program

IQAC members deliberated upon the need of initiating a summer-internship program for all students from across the disciplines and areas. The university can initiate a dialogue with foreign Universities that offer credible summer programs (1-3 weeks long) and disseminate this information to students. NU can act as a facilitator in the process and ease the lengthy process for students.





3. 11.3: Inclusion of Indian Knowledge Systems in Curriculum

Given the vastness of knowledge reservoir of Indian though, culture and tradition, and New Education Policy 2020, IQAC members felt an urgent need to value this aspect and incorporate it our curriculum, pedagogy, and teaching-learning frameworks. IQAC instructed all area directors and Deans to work on this idea and bring forth their perspectives and inputs in this regard. Although TALF has always been a guiding ethos at NIIT, since 2013, in terms of curating Asian heritage and knowledge domains in teaching methodologies and teaching material as well, but more emphasis needs to be laid on incorporating Indian research, writing, literature and theories well into the curriculum and pedagogy.

4. 11.4: New Courses/electives in Core domain of Computer Science and Biotechnology. IQAC members deliberated upon the need of introducing new elective courses in core domains of Computer Science and Biotechnology. Geographic Information System area members were asked to develop and curate new courses to suit the credit requirements and changing landscape of Computer technology.
